4. General Operator Equipment:

- (1) 2-meter HT
 - (a) Spare battery packs (12 hour capability - **REQUIRED**)
 - (b) Earphone or headset (**REQUIRED, ABSOLUTELY NO VOX!!**)
 - (c) Pre-program frequencies (see below)
- (2) Food snacks, water, etc for up to 10 hours. We will have an approximately 1 hour break on Saturday for lunch.
- (3) Clothing (layered, prefer forest green or dark colors if possible)
 - (a) Cap/hat
 - (b) Jacket/Raincoat & bad weather gear
 - (c) Boots, comfortable & suitable for hiking & bad weather
 - (d) Sunscreen
- (4) Course Maps -- PROVIDED
- (5) Compass (OPTIONAL, BUT RECOMMENDED)
- (6) Binoculars could be very helpful at some locations
- (7) Notepad or clipboard with tablet and pens/pencils.
- (8) Portable stool or seat (OPTIONAL)

- (9) Directions to Camp Area: From I-25 enter south gate of US Air Force Academy. From the guard shack go 2.2 miles and turn left onto Pine Drive. Go 2.4 miles and turn left just past Fire Station #1 onto Monument Creek Road. Go 0.2 mile and turn right onto gravel road just past a white building with a red roof and just before the start of the guard rails. Go 0.4 mile straight in to the camp. Look for KØHBZ's trailer to the left (antenna farm & CO flag). Talk in on 146.865.

5. Frequencies:

Primary - 146.865 (negative offset, no tone)

Secondary - 146.835 (negative offset, no tone)

Back-up - 146.970 (negative offset, 100 Hz tone) -- Use only if all else fails!
